IMPACT BREASTFEEDING

Breastfeeding not only provides good nutrition, but it also plays an important role in food security and reducing inequalities by improving child development. Undernutrition is estimated to be associated with 2.7 million child deaths annually.

The first 2 years of a child's life are particularly important as optimal nutrition during this period lowers morbidity and mortality, reduces the risk of chronic disease, and fosters better development overall.

MOTHER AND CHILD HEALTH BENEFITS

Exclusive breastfeeding for 6 months has many benefits for the infant and mother such as protection against gastrointestinal infections and reducing newborn mortality. It is also offering a critical source of energy and nutrients for children between 6-24 months during illness and malnutrition.

The risk of mortality due to diarrhoea and other infections can increase in infants who are either partially breastfed or not breastfed at all. Longer durations of breastfeeding also contribute to the health and well-being of mothers as it reduces the risk of ovarian and breast cancer

BREASTFEEDING SUPPLIES

IDA has added two breastfeeding related products to its portfolio; a feeding cup - supporting newborns with breastfeeding difficulties, and a manual breast pump - allowing mothers more options in their breastfeeding routines.

- Undernutrition is associated with 45% of child deaths.
- About 44% of infants 0-6 months old are exclusively breastfed.
- Over 820 000 children's lives could be saved every year among children under 5 years, if all children 0-23 months were optimally breastfed.
- Breastfeeding improves IQ, school attendance, and is associated with higher income in adult life.
- Improving child development and reducing health costs through breastfeeding results in economic gains for individual families as well as at the national level.
